# Mahogany

Mahogany is known for its rich, deep colour and subtle grain, often used in traditional and luxury interiors.

The colour reflects these characteristics: warm undertones, a refined linear pattern, and a polished, elegant appearance.



## Grey Oak

Grey Oak is a contemporary wood finish that blends neutral grey tones with a natural oak grain, often used in modern interiors for its versatility and understated elegance.

This colour aligns well with current design trends favoring cooler, earthy tones that pair easily with minimalist and Scandinavian aesthetics.



## **Dark Grey Oak / Smoked Oak**

## **White Oak / Natural Oak**

## **Whitewashed Oak / Nordic White Oak**

White Oak is a pale, neutral-toned wood with subtle, straight grain patterns, with a bleached or whitewashed finish.

It's highly popular in Scandinavian, minimalist, and modern interiors due to its light, airy, and clean aesthetic.



## **Natural Oak - Linear Grain**

## White Oak

## **Light Ash / Bleached Ash**

It has a contemporary and airy aesthetic, often used in modern interiors, coastal or Scandinavian design, or spaces seeking brightness and neutrality.

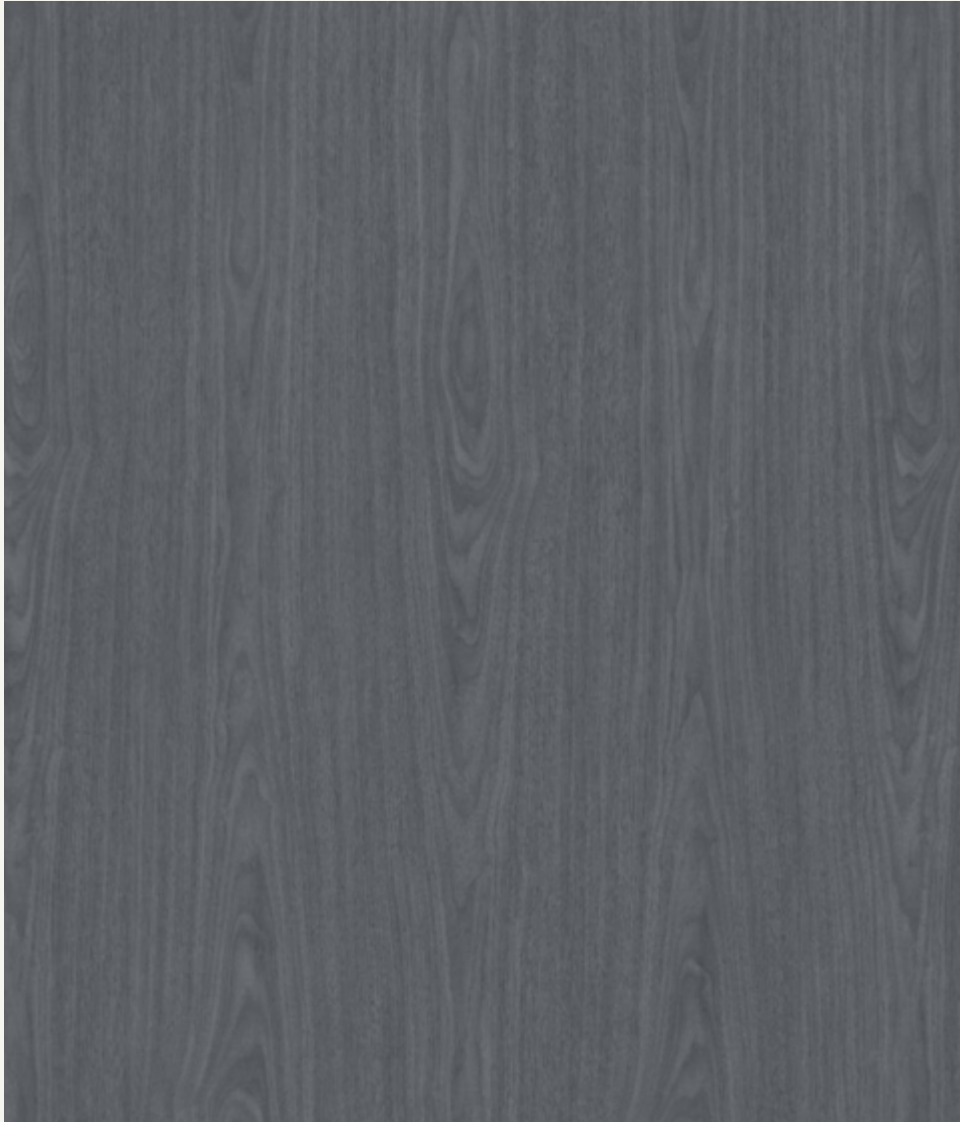




## Whitewashed Pine

Whitewashed Pine has a light, desaturated beige or ivory tone with visible wood grain in soft grayish-tan hues – often marketed as Nordic Whitewood, Scandinavian Light Ash, Whitewashed Spruce, Arctic Pine or Chalked Oak.

This style is popular in Scandinavian interior design, offering a clean, airy aesthetic while retaining natural wood character.



## Dark Grey Ash

Dark Grey Ash with a graphite-stained woodgrain finish features cool, muted tones of deep grey with subtle blue undertones, mimicking Charcoal Oak, Smoked Ash, Graphite Walnut, Midnight Elm, Stonewashed Ebony.

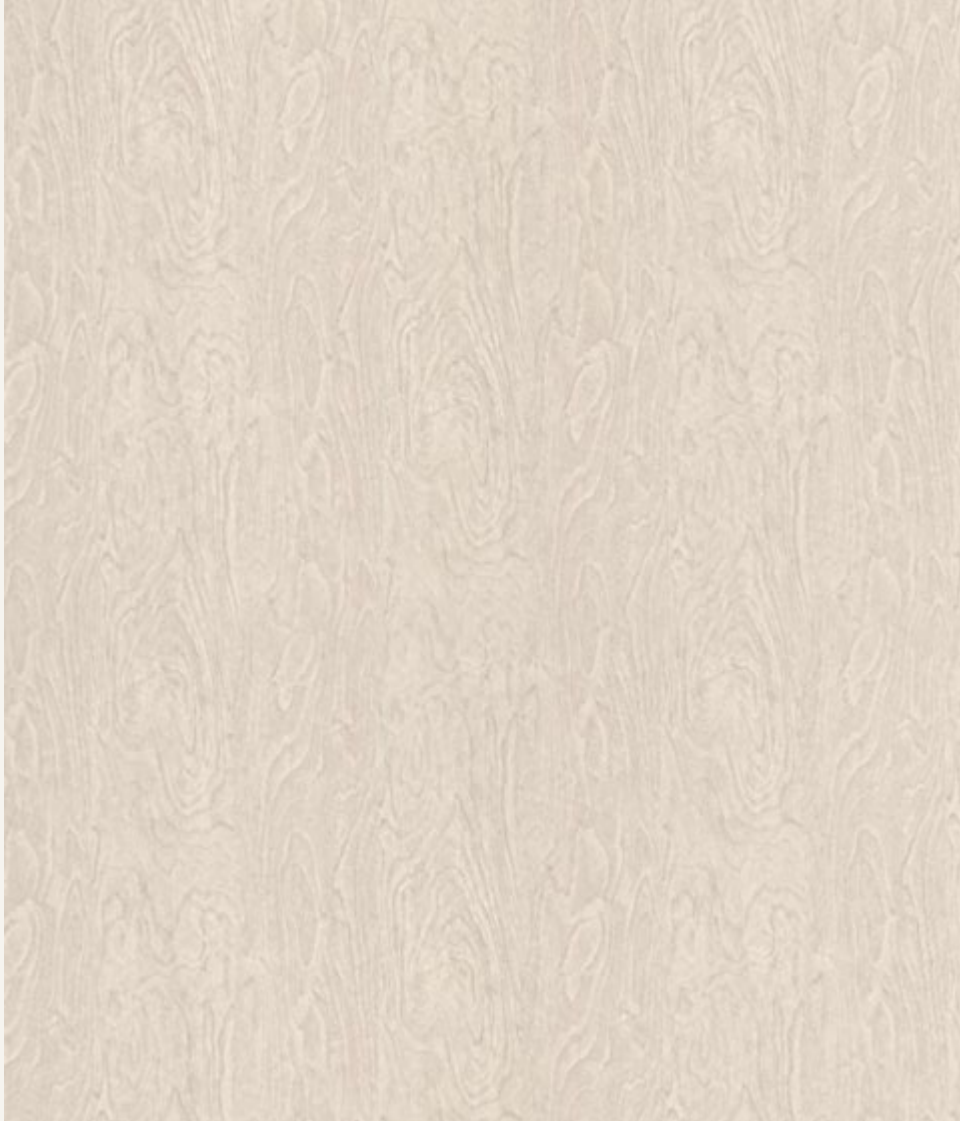
It's a modern, elegant look often used in high-end interiors, cabinetry, or furniture where a bold, yet neutral statement is desired.



## Rich Brown Walnut

Rich Brown Walnut with a dark teak woodgrain finish features deep, warm brown tones with a blend of medium and dark striations – evoking an exotic, high-end wood veneer. Close resemblance to Classic Walnut, Dark Zebrano, Smoked Teak, Wenge Brown or Espresso Oak.

This tone is often used in luxury furniture, executive office spaces, and upscale interiors to convey sophistication and timeless warmth.



## Light Maple

Light Maple with a blonde ash woodgrain. It features a soft beige to pale taupe base with subtle, swirling grain patterns – giving it a smooth, refined look often seen in Natural Maple, Limed Ash, Blond Oak, Sandwashed Birch or Ivory Elm.

This tone is ideal for bright, minimalist interiors and Scandinavian-style spaces, offering warmth without heaviness.



## Light Grey Oak

Light Grey Oak with a weathered ash finish. It features a cool-toned grey base with whitewashed grain patterns, evoking a contemporary, neutral aesthetic. Similar shades in design catalogs include Silver Birch, Driftwood Grey, Stonewashed Oak, Frosted Maple and Urban Ash.

This tone is popular in modern, Scandinavian, or industrial interiors – offering a clean, airy feel with natural texture.

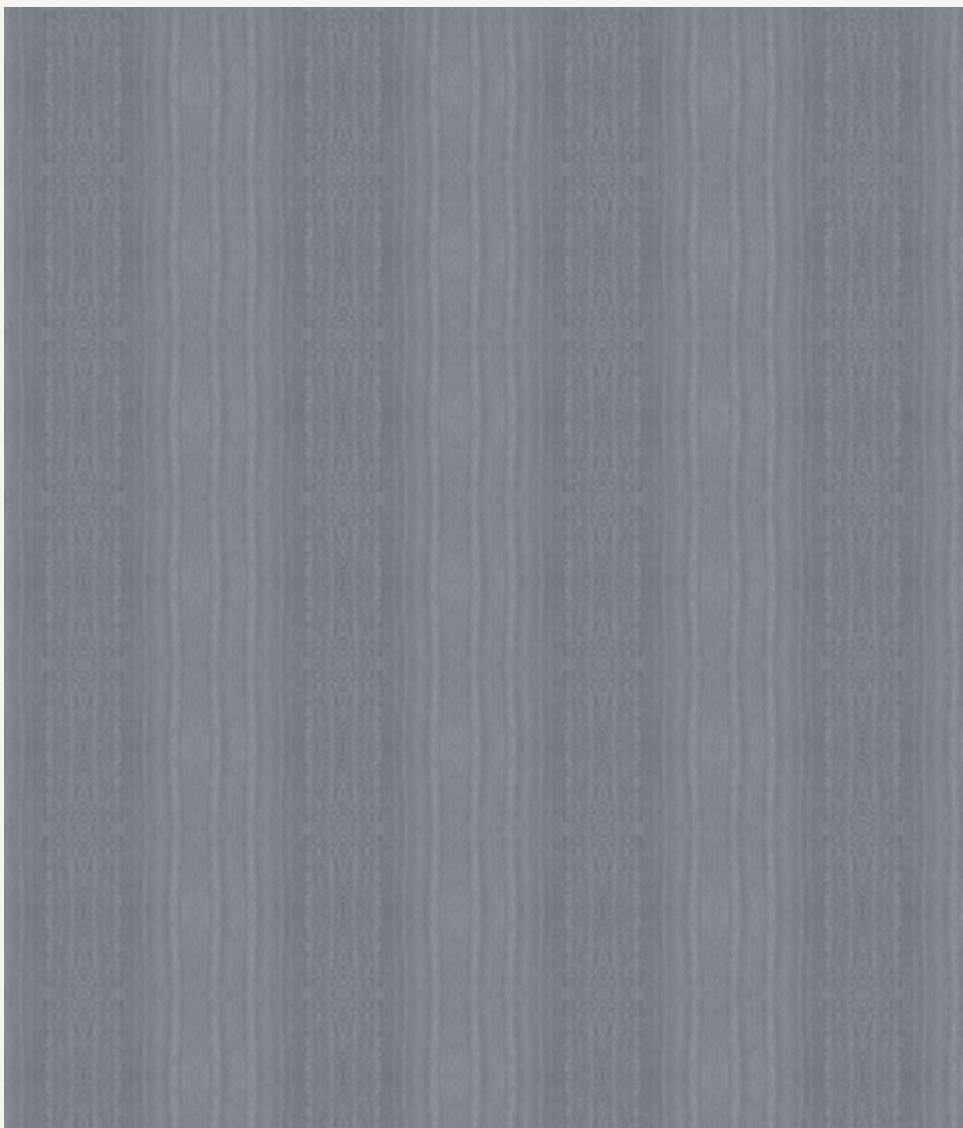




## Macassar Ebony

Macassar Ebony, a luxurious and exotic hardwood known for its dramatic contrast of deep brown and reddish-golden streaks. The high-contrast, vertical striping gives it a bold and sophisticated appearance. Comparable tones in design and veneer surfaces include Striped Rosewood, Zircote Flame, Tropical Walnut and Royal Zebrano.

This finish is often used in luxury furniture, statement wall panels, cabinetry, and premium musical instruments, where visual richness and uniqueness are desired.



## Brushed Steel Grey

Brushed Steel Grey with a cool graphite woodgrain finish. It features alternating fine and slightly wider vertical striations in soft, muted greys – giving it a modern, linear and slightly industrial appearance, while still mimicking natural wood. Comparable colors include Urban Greywood, Shadow Elm, Smoked Silver Oak, Brushed Graphite and Titan Ash.

This finish is ideal for contemporary interiors, office furniture, wall panels, or cabinetry, offering a sleek and professional look with subtle texture.



## Brushed Steel Grey

Bleached Pine with a light white oak finish. The soft, creamy-beige tone with subtle woodgrain patterns suggests a Scandinavian-inspired aesthetic – bright, airy, and natural. Comparable colours include Nordic Oak, Chalked Elm, Whitewashed Oak, Polar Ash and Alpine Spruce.

It's a popular choice in modern minimalistic or coastal interiors, adding warmth without visual weight.





## Brushed Steel Grey

Golden Bamboo with a natural teak finish. It features a warm honey-brown base with subtle, fine vertical grains – offering a clean, linear, and slightly exotic aesthetic. Similar colours include Golden Teak, Natural Bamboo, Honey Oak, Caramel Birch and Amberwood.

This finish is popular in contemporary furniture, cabinetry, and paneling, especially where a warm yet minimalist look is desired.
